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Code of Conduct for Students

The aim of this code is to ensure that Hungarian Community School, Adelaide Inc. is a safe place where learning can take place, that the property and reputation of the school is protected and that students develop self-discipline and consideration for others. The code of conduct clarifies the standards of behaviour that are expected of students attending Hungarian Community School, Adelaide Inc.

All children who come to Hungarian Community School, Adelaide Inc. have a right to feel and be safe. We are committed to the safety and wellbeing of all children and young people accessing our services and the welfare of the children in our care will always be our first priority. We aim to create a child safe and child friendly environment where all children are valued, feel safe, be treated with respect by other students and teachers, and are listened to.

Hungarian Community School, Adelaide Inc. is committed to the safety and wellbeing of all children and young people accessing our service. We also support the rights and well-being of our staff and volunteers and encourage their active participation in building and maintaining a secure environment for all participants.

Student Responsibilities:

- sign out through arriving before and after leaving school between 5pm and 8pm to their teacher
- accept school policies regarding behaviour
- act and work co-operatively with other students and teachers
- respect the learning needs of other students
- respect the privacy of employees, teachers, volunteers and members of the School's organization and other students
- take progressive responsibility for their own learning, to work consistently and complete tasks as required
- be tolerant of differences
- be punctual and regular in attendance
- show pride in personal and school achievement
- students shall not leave the school grounds during the day except on official school excursions, unless they are accompanied by their parent/guardian
- inform parents of educational progress and to ensure that all school communication is effectively delivered
- to accept the authority of members of staff and observe specific rules which may be made from time to time
- to behave in a manner which does not endanger the health and safety of themselves or others
- to behave with courtesy and consideration for others, in particular, students must refrain from all forms of bullying and harassment
- to refrain from behaviour which would interrupt the work of any class or hinder the learning opportunities of other students
- to respect school property and the property of staff and other student
- to complete work set by teachers promptly and to the best of their ability and to take full advantage of the educational opportunities offered at the school



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- to dress neatly and with due regard for health, hygiene and safety
- students are not permitted to possess or smoke cigarettes, possess or use or be under the influence of alcohol or un-prescribed drugs or other substances harmful to health, at school, on school excursions,
- do not bring food item that contain nuts.

Students are expected to behave with courtesy and consideration for others. Violence, bullying, verbal intimidation and offensive behaviour are not acceptable, and students are expected to behave in a manner consistent with safety and to avoid such practices as running in the building or throwing missiles. Students are not permitted to bring weapons or dangerous objects or materials to school. Riding bicycles or skateboards, etc., in the school premises is not permitted.

Note the detailed rules listed in the Code of Conduct for Students may be varied by the Principal in consultation with appropriate members of the school community, consistent with this policy.

I have discussed the Student Code of Conduct with my child and I believe my child will do his/her best to follow the Hungarian Community School, Adelaide Inc.'s Code of Conduct. I have also reinforced the need to speak with a trusted adult, (e.g. parent or teacher) to seek advice on how to deal with a problem.
